- Chinese is a tonal language, which means, the language has ‘tunes’ to follow, like when we sing a song. There are four tones in Mandarin Chinese. The first tone is level, the second is rising, the third goes down and up, and the fourth goes down. Pinyin is how to show the pronunciation of Chinese. In your opinion, which is pinyin?
