


Welcome back to school.

Year 9 Virtual China Trip

Language learning and cultural experiences are at the heart of the Mandarin Excellence Programme. To ensure our students did not miss out the MEP and Chinese Universities organized an extensive2 week programme of learning events, covering cultural topics to strengthen language learning.

Our programme was presented by Beijing university teachers and staff, with the opportunity for our pupils to learn from and work with Chinese students of their own age. We are all extremely proud of the maturity shown, contributions made and active participation of our students. Despite the disappointment of not actually being in China. Well done Yr 9 now 10. 10.





What were the aims of the Virtual China Event?

The detailed and highly organised course provided Mandarin Language input through lessons, practice tasks with Chinese students, live and recorded visits to cultural and tourist locations, live workshops and panel events to meet Chinese young people and experts, UK classroom and self-study activity.

There were varied China-based virtual cultural experiences relevant to the students' interests and futures and students enjoyed collaboration with Chinese peers (secondary-age students) on tasks and projects.

The topics and events included:

- A Panda Zoo, Chengdu
- The Winter Olympics, Beijing
- A Chinese School, Shanghai
- Environment protection

Teaching and learning was delivered to MEP students across the UK from 14 different Chinese Universities from 10 different locations.




After each session the students had a further 30 minutes to practice what they had learnt through interactive games. Teachers were on hand to support individuals, and answer questions. Everyone enjoyed the day.



Each session was 30 minutes long with pupils encouraged to interact with the teaching and learning, making contributions, answering questions, and practicing Mandarin speaking, listening, writing and reading skills.

By far the most exciting event this term has been the year 7 Mandarin Intensive Learning day with Lyng Hall school hosting year 7 Mandarin students from Finham Park School and Finham Park 2.

It was a day filled with laughter, enjoyment, creativity, friendship and fun, learning about and celebrating the Chinese Mid Autumn festival, its customs and traditions.

Our first opportunity for pupils to meet and work together with others from different schools, sharing the common aim...learning the Mandarin language and culture, together!





The day could not have been so successful without the contributions made, in the planning and delivery, by specialist subject staff at Lyng Hall school and the FP MAT teachers and staff.

Year 10 Mandarin students were also student ambassadors, supporting students all day. They were mature, caring and kind.








Students from LH, FPS and FP2 were split into 4 mixed groups, completing 3 of the 4 activities. Learning new skills and making new friends. Here is an example itinerary. One of the groups...who can you spot?



The day focused on celebrating and learning about The Mid Autumn festival or the Moon Festival and centered around the story of Chang'e., the moon goddess.

There were 4 activities:

- Drama—depicting the story of Chang'e
- Baking Moon biscuits
- Shadow puppet making and performance
- Chinese moon festival lantern making



To begin, Miss Scott and Miss Lazarska asked students to watch a short video about the legend of the Moon goddess Chnag'e.

As an ice-breaker each pupil was given one part of the story. They then had to work together to put the story in order.

Afterwards they worked in smaller groups to produce and perform.



Chang'e is an important figure in Chinese myths and legends.


She is remembered and celebrated during the Mid-Autumn or Moon Festival.

People give mooncakes in her honour.

Many children believe that Chang'e still lives on the moon. They try to find her shape on the moon, especially during the Moon Festival, when the moon is bright and full.







The most popular activity was cooking the mooncake biscuits. Mooncakes are complex and need more time than we had to make so we improvised.

We still used the mooncake top presses to make mooncake shortbread.

At the end of the day each student was given 3 shortbread to take home, which were very tasty!

Huge thanks to Miss Zhu who delivered them to FP2 after their coach had to leave earlier than expected.



Cooking: Moon eakes-biscuits

Mrs Hensman set the challenge, gave instructions and pupils set to work. In groups of 2/3 mixed school groups they set about making a lovely mess, creating delicious biscuit and what is more they tidied up afterwards!

Method Shortbread

Preheat the oven to 190C/170C Fan/Gas 5.

Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth.

Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste. Turn on to a work surface and gently roll out until the paste is 2cm thick.

Cut into rounds using the cutters provided and place onto a baking tray. Sprinkle with caster sugar and chill in the fridge. Whilst they ae in the fridge clean up!

Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes, or until pale golden-brown. Set aside to cool on a wire rack.



The best picture of day!

3 pupils from 3 different schools, never having met before, having fun, working together for a shared goal.

Challenge

In groups we are going to make our own moon cakes. You will be making shortbread biscuits to represent the moon cake.

To make the biscuit you will need: Ingredients

125g/4oz unsalted butter, softened 55g/2oz caster sugar, plus extra to finish 180g/6oz plain flour





Shadow puppet making and performing took great concentration. Mr James, LH Subject leader for Art and Design had the task of directing pupils in the use of scissors and he completed the more detailed cutting that required art knives.

Every single pupil listened carefully to the instructions and you can see from the photos they were very focused.

They made the puppets then performed the Chang'e story against a the projector light, which were recorded. We hope to share these and a montage of photos on the FROG site soon.


The lovely part of this was that students were very proud of their finished puppets and took them home with them.

In fact, we all had a go and made quite a collection to decorate the Mandarin department at Lyng Hall School.










The final collection of Lanterns created by students and staff from Lyng Hall School, Finham Park School and Finham Park 2

Meet the Teacher: Mr Josh Harrison FP2


This September we welcomed a new member of teaching staff to our FP MAT Mandarin teaching team at Finham Park 2, Harrison lão shī, Mr Harrison.

I am extremely passionate about China and have been since a very young age. Over the next few years I hope to share my experiences with the pupils and nurture them into becoming cultured bilinguals.


